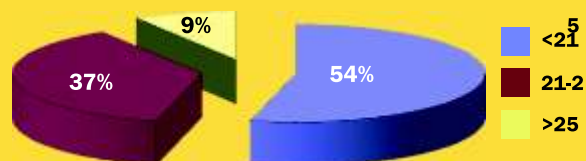
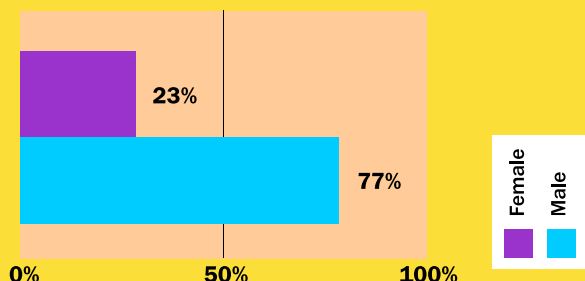

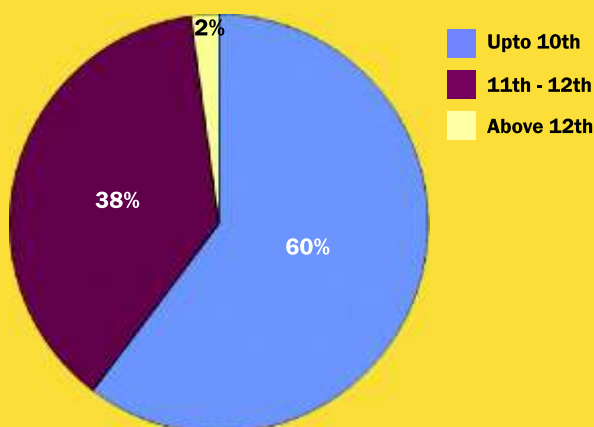
AGE PROFILE OF STUDENTS TRAINED
